Rose Warren Elementary Students Humberto Quinones, Michael McMahon and Dennis Martinez, won "Best Elementary School Group Entry" in the Green Dreamers Art and Science Fair, held at the Springs Preserve. They demonstrated their entry of a solar-powered car that they built themselves and they answered questions about it to earn the first-place rating.
