ACE Academy background information:

Aviation Career Education (ACE) is a program developed by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). The Organization of Black Aerospace Professionals (OBAP) has partnered with the FAA and Tuskegee Airmen, Inc (TAI) to cosponsor ACE Academies in selected locations.

The Las Vegas ACE Academy is a six-day event, **July 16 – 21, 2012**, for students ages 13-17 who have a general interest in learning about aviation. The goal of ACE Academy is to expose underrepresented students to the many different careers in the field of aviation, show them the practical application of the Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) subjects they study in the classroom, and motivate them to strive for excellence both in the classroom and the community. The base location for the Academy will be the Operations Building at the **North Las Vegas Airport, 2370 Airport Drive, N. Las Vegas, NV 89032**.

Aviation is an excellent motivational tool for many students. We recognize that not all students who are exposed to the ACE program will become pilots or air traffic controllers and indeed, many will not enter career fields related to the aviation industry, however, we do feel that the exposure will be an invaluable experience for everyone who participates.

Every facet of the aviation industry is built on a foundation of discipline. Students quickly learn that they must practice self-discipline, and be self-motivated to be successful at flying. There is no "pause" button in an airplane – decisions must be made "on the go". Students of aviation are quick to adopt the professionalism and discipline required to pilot a plane, and it is inspiring to see the sense of pride and accomplishment they exude after mastering a particular skill level. We think this attitude will follow the students in whatever career they decide to pursue.

ACE Academy is hosted by the Organization of Black Aerospace Professionals, Inc., (OBAP), Tuskegee Airmen, Inc (TAI), and the National Black Coalition of Federal Aviation Employees (NBCFAE). These 501(c)(3) organizations are partnering with businesses in the community to sponsor this first time Las Vegas ACE Academy in 2012. We hope to host an ACE Academy each year in the future to enable local students to participate in this life-changing program. All of the ACE Academy

counselors are aerospace professionals who volunteer their time to motivate, mentor, and chaperone the students. We are confident that we will once again be able to make a difference in the lives of the children from the Southern Nevada community.

Objectives

-To demonstrate to students the importance of education, and to inspire them to attend a college or university to reach their goals.

-To demonstrate to students the many opportunities available in the field of aviation, and to inspire them to pursue careers in aviation.

-To demonstrate to students the importance of being good citizens with good moral character, and to inspire them to be not only productive citizens but community leaders.

-To demonstrate to students the importance of "giving back", and to inspire them to volunteer to help improve their respective communities

<u>Tools</u>

-Use classroom instruction based on flight school curriculum to emphasize the importance of education and attending institutions of higher learning.

-Use field trips to aviation museums, airports, and flight schools to give students exposure to different career fields within aviation.

-Use Aviation professionals from different specialties (pilots, mechanics, ATC controllers, etc) to give presentations, mentor and inspire students through their roles as Academy counselors.

-Use the volunteerism of the Academy counselors as an example to inspire the students to use aviation as a tool to "give back" to their communities.

Funding Requirements

-\$300 covers the cost for one student to attend the Ace Academy for all six days.
