

NEVADA READING WEEK: MARCH 3 – 7

BRINLEY MIDDLE SCHOOL	Activities include Book Fair contests and drawings, DEAR (Drop Everything and Read), and listening to guest readers. Daily themes include Did You Know Day (crazy, wacky facts to be read at the beginning of class), Read My Shirt Day, Poetry Slam Day, Get Caught Reading Day, and Professional Dress Day.
CONNERS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL	Activities include DEAR, book Bingo, hallway decorating, a scavenger hunt, and listening to mystery readers. Students are given a challenge to collectively read 70,000 minutes during the week. Dress-up days include Hats Off to Reading Day, Read a T-Shirt Day, Book Buddy Day (carry a book that matches a buddy), Turn the Page Thursday (wear something inside out), and Relax & Read Day (pajamas).
ESCOBEDO MIDDLE SCHOOL	Activities include a door decorating contest, a bookmark decorating contest, book swaps, and listening to guest readers. Dress-up days include Reading is a Window to: History, Travel, Imagination (favorite fiction character), Future, Other People’s World (shirts representing famous people).
FERTITA MIDDLE SCHOOL	Activities include listening to mystery readers, DEAR, Make a Date with a Book, a bookmark designing contest, a book drive, and an author visit from Mike Graf. Spirit Day themes will consist of students wearing “Be Kind” shirts, Dr. Seuss attire, spirit shirts for the home basketball game, favorite dystopian society outfits, and College Day apparel.
GALLOWAY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL	Reading Projects include door decorating, a Walk the Halls event, a bookmark contest, a character study with Wizard of Oz, and a “Literacy with Mr. Lemur” assembly. Other activities include DEAR, Bingo, trivia, and a Book Buffet. Spirit week themes include Wear a Readable Shirt or Be Kind Day, Twin Day, Dr. Seuss Day, Dress Like Your Favorite Character Day, and Pajama Day.
LAKE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL	With the goal of students reading 3,000 books, students can participate in a reading chain. Other activities include a book report poster project, and listening to guest readers and mystery readers. Dress-up days consist of Crazy Hat/Hair Day, Mixed Up Shoe/Sock Day, Read a Shirt Day or Backwards Day, Pajama Day, and School Spirit Day.
RED ROCK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL	Activities include a door decorating contest, book Bingo, reading mystery books, reading Tweet of the Days, DEAR, and listening to guest speakers. Dress-up days includes wearing a t-shirt with words or a Nevada Reading Week t-shirt, Tourist Day, Imagination Day, Mismatched Day, Pajama Day.

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RUNDLE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL	Activities include door decorating, uncovering hidden messages around the hallways, There’s a Wocket in My Pocket (ask students to recite the poem in their pocket), Walk for Books, and a Read-A-Thon. Dress-up days include Hats off to Nevada Reading Week, Reading Jogs the Mind (athletic attire), Rundle Reads! (Rundle t-shirt), Reading is a Window to Your Future, and Relax and Read (pajamas).
SAVILLE MIDDLE SCHOOL	Activities include a door decorating contest, a bookmark designing contest, book swaps, and trivia. Staff members will be participating in contests including “Best Spirit”, “Best Bookmark”, “Best Photo”, and “Best Video”. Dress-up day themes include Character Day, Dr. Seuss Foot Day (dress feet in favorite socks/shoes), Read a T-Shirt Day, Neon Day, and Superhero Day.
SCHORR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL	Activities include listening to mystery readers, Indiana Bones assemblies, Kevin Janison assemblies, and a Read Around the School event. Dress-up day themes include Count Your Words Shirt Day, Dress Like your Favorite Book Character Day, and Poem in Your Hat Day.
WATSON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL	Activities include book swaps, book trivia, literature Bingo, DEAR, a door decorating contest, and a bookmark decorating contest. Dress-up day themes include Hats Off to Nevada Reading Week, Happy Birthday Dr. Seuss, Watson Wranglers Read (spirit day), Dr. Seuss Foot Book Day (favorite socks/shoes), and Dress Like Your Favorite Book Character Day.
WENDELL WILLIAMS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL	Activities include a door decorating contest, a place mat decorating contest, and Pop Quiz Day. Students will participate in reading chains that represent books read by students, and the goal is 2,000 books. Other activities include playing Bingo, and listening to guest speakers and mystery readers.
WOLFF ELEMENTARY SCHOOL	Activities include participating in homework reading challenges, Bingo, and a Read-A-Thon. Dress-up days include Reading is a Window to: History, Travel, Your Imagination (favorite fiction character), Your Future, and Other People (dress like famous people in history).
